## Eligibility

This competition is open to the public. All photographs must be the original work and have never been exhibited.

### Entries

The basic entry fee covering three prints are \$18.00 for adults and \$12.00 for students with valid student identification card. Two additional prints will be accepted at \$5.00 each. Make non-refundable checks payable to Cleveland AIA.

# Preparation

A completed Entry Form and

Entry Fee must accompany each entry. All photographs are to be submitted in slide format. <u>Do not send original work.</u>
Each slide must be clearly labeled on the back listing the entrant's name, occupation, and photograph title. Entrant must include a self-addressed-stamped-envelope.

Accepted work must be framed in black frames (e.g. Nielsen frame #15-21) with white mat boards (e.g. Crescent #918 or #1613) and ready to be placed on gallery walls. Call Merrill David (216.391.0988 and Bancroft Gallery (216.241.2592), for processing and framing discounts. A scan of the accepted images must be burned on a cd and accompany the framed piece upon drop off. The scans must be in JPEG format at a 300dpi resolution.

#### Agreement and Liability

CAi is not responsible for lost or damaged works. Exhibited work will be covered during the show by limited insurance against theft or vandalism, but not for damage from other causes. Work may not be removed until the end of the show. Entrant grants CAi permission to reproduce selected exhibited works for promotional and fundraising purposes. Any photographs left unclaimed 30 days after the close of the exhibition will be disposed of at CAi's discretion
